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# EDUCATION AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF TEACHERS

## Master Trainers Selection Program by Moawin Foundation & ABCTE

Moawin Foundation, in collaboration with the American Board for Certification of Teachers' Excellence (ABCTE), organized a three-day Master Trainers Selection Program, which began on January 6, 2025. Candidates who had completed intensive training in August 2024 underwent interviews and demonstrated their teaching skills. ABCTE trainers evaluated them and made the final selection of Master Trainers. The chosen Master Trainers will lead future training sessions in their designated clusters.



## Two-day teacher training workshop on Multigrade Teaching

With the partnership of Taleemabad, Moawin Foundation conducted a two-day teachers training workshop on Multigrade Teaching for PEF-PSRP schools in Jand and Lawa, attended by 210 teachers from Jand, Lawa Attock, and Taxila. The workshop focused on effective multigrade teaching strategies, timetable management, and integrating SLOs to enhance classroom learning experiences.

## One day training Session by WWF

Moawin Foundation, in collaboration with WWF, conducted a one-day training for 25 participants from 19 schools in District Sheikhpura. Led by WWF trainers, the session covered Nature Club establishment, child safeguarding, and best practices for club management, enabling participants to advocate for environmental awareness in their schools and communities. ### **Urban Sole Directors Visit Moawin Foundation Schools and VTI Mahmunwali**
