# MOAWIN FOUNDATION - SCHOOLS ACTIVITIES

## Career Counseling Session at People's School Ubauro

A career counseling session was conducted at People's School Ubauro by Principal Abdul Hameed for students of Grades VIII to X. The session guided students on making informed subject choices based on their interests and career goals. It included self-assessment, exploration of career paths, and advice on subject selection. Students actively participated and found the session helpful and encouraging.



## World Environment Day Celebrated in Baltistan

Moawin Foundation schools across Baltistan marked World Environment Day with vibrant activities promoting climate action and environmental stewardship. Students and teachers participated in tree plantations, awareness walks, art displays, and cleanliness drives—demonstrating a collective commitment to building a cleaner, greener, and more sustainable future.





## Monitoring Visits of Moawin Foundation & CAI to Schools Across Gilgit & Baltistan

Moawin Foundation's monitoring team visited multiple schools to assess academic progress and engage with communities. Activities included staff orientations, school finalizations, and Key Informant Interviews (KIIs) with students, teachers, scholarship recipients, and entrepreneurs. Focus Group Discussions (FGDs) were held with School Management Committees and mothers, alongside spot checks, Grade 5 and 8 assessments, and reviews of ECD setups and small enterprises like apricot processing in schools across Gilgit & Baltistan.

In parallel, the Central Asia Institute (CAI) Evaluation Team visited 12 schools in Gilgit and 28 in Baltistan, including the Apricot Dehydration Training Center, to evaluate educational progress and community level impact. These joint efforts reaffirm Moawin Foundation's commitment to quality education and grassroots development in the region.



## Empowering Young Voices: Life Skills Session in Bagrote

A life skills session was conducted at Moawin Foundation's adopted Government School Farfo, Bagrote, engaging 50 female students from grades 6 to 9 along with female teachers. The session focused on vital topics such as child protection, abuse awareness, mental health, harassment prevention, and effective communication. Designed to empower participants with practical knowledge, the session promoted emotional well-being, personal safety, and the importance of healthy relationships through open dialogue.





# EXPOSURE VISIT TO NUST ISLAMABAD

## Inspiring Innovation: Students Visit SINES at NUST

Moawin Foundation arranged an exposure visit for students of Islamabad Model School for Girls (E-8) to the School of Interdisciplinary Engineering and Sciences (SINES) at NUST, Islamabad.

Students from grades 9 and 10 explored state-of-the-art facilities including the Supercomputing Lab, Aerial Robotics, XR-HIVE Lab, Biomechanics Lab, and various other research labs.

Experts from each lab showcased how their research is addressing real-world challenges and contributing to the socio-economic growth of Pakistan through innovation, technology, and problem-solving. Students were inspired to envision themselves as future scientists, engineers, and changemakers.

## Strengthening Skills Training: PSDA Visit to VTI Mehmonwali

The Punjab Skills Development Authority (PSDA) team visited Vocational Training Institute (VTI) Mehmonwali to assess the institute's tools and facilities as part of the verification process for its one-year registration application. This application was submitted by the Principal under the supervision of PVTC - Punjab Vocational Training Council, with active facilitation and support from Moawin Foundation. The visit marked an important step toward formal registration and ensuring quality vocational training for the community.



## Cultivating Skills: Agricultural Training Session in Bagrote

Moawin Foundation team visited the Dehydration Center in Bagrote, where they conducted an engaging session with local participants. The session focused on pre-harvesting techniques, included hands-on training, and concluded with the distribution of essential materials to 15 trainees. This initiative aims to empower communities with practical skills and knowledge to enhance agricultural productivity and livelihood opportunities.

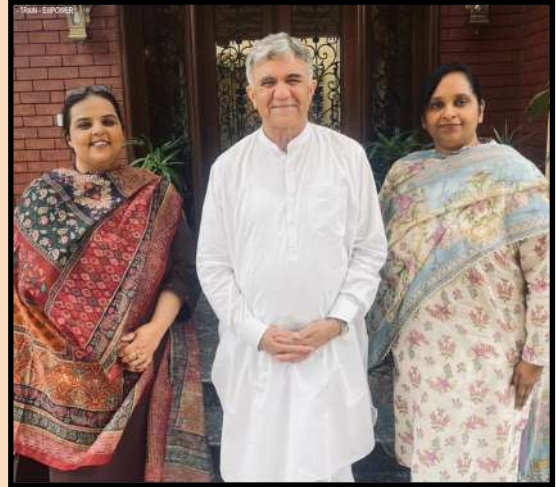




## MEETING & VISITS
