Moawin Students Shine at NUST Young Students Engagement Program (NYSEP) 2025

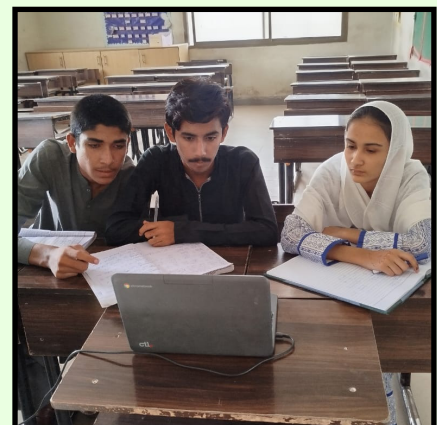

LUMS Virtual coaching Empowering Students at People's School Ghotki

In July 2025, Moawin Foundation, in collaboration with LUMS, successfully ran Virtual coaching and E-Learning at People's School Ghotki. A total of 40 students participated in regular sessions conducted by 10 teachers, held four days a week. The program not only enhanced students' learning but also integrated innovative teaching methods and technology driven approaches. These efforts have continued to strengthen the academic journey of students, ensuring they stay motivated and better prepared for the future.



TEACHERS TRAINING

Pedagogy Training for Community Teachers in Gilgit

Moawin Foundation held a 05 day pedagogy training for 15 community teachers (8 women, 7 men) in Gilgit. Led by Mr. Asif with support from AFAQ, the program strengthened teachers' skills and introduced modern classroom practices.



Building Safe and Happy Spaces Training

Moawin Foundation head teachers participated in a training by Kiran Foundation, led by Ms. Sabina Khatri, on "Building Safe and Happy Spaces." The sessions focused on understanding trauma, mindfulness, holistic wellbeing, supportive environments, and community transformation.

IT Training for Teachers in Baltistan

Moawin Foundation conducted a two-day IT training in the Baltistan region, engaging 30 community teachers (24 men, 6 women) from adopted schools. The sessions built essential computer skills and guided teachers in using LEDs, laptops, and desktops effectively. The training also emphasized integrating Taleemabad and Sabaq Foundation digital content into classrooms.



Session on Child Abuse and Trauma at People's School Ghotki

At People's School Ghotki, Ms. Tania – ECCE Teacher conducted a session on child abuse and trauma for the female staff. She shared key learnings from her training at Kiran Foundation last year, helping teachers better understand and respond to sensitive issues.



Life Skills-Based Education Training in Gilgit

Moawin Foundation, in collaboration with the Aahung team, successfully organized a five-day Life Skills-Based Education (LSBE) training for 60 teachers from six districts of Gilgit. This initiative was designed to strengthen educators' knowledge and teaching approaches around essential life skills, enabling them to foster confident, informed, and empowered classrooms.

Prior to Aahung's involvement, Moawin Foundation had already laid the groundwork by conducting LSBE sessions through two experienced trainers. The current training built on that foundation, equipping participants with tools to integrate life skills into daily teaching practices and address the holistic needs of their students.

The program concluded with a certificate distribution ceremony, celebrating the commitment of teachers who are now better prepared to inspire positive change and community transformation through education.



MOAWIN FOUNDATION - SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Fruits Dehydration and Preservation Training in Gilgit-Baltistan

Moawin Foundation organized fruit dehydration and preservation training sessions across three centers in Gilgit-Baltistan, equipping community members with practical skills to turn local produce into value-added products.

The training focused on creating items such as dried apricots, apricot jam, and vegetable pickles, enabling participants to preserve seasonal harvests while also generating income opportunities. By building these skills, the initiative not only promotes food sustainability but also supports local entrepreneurship in the region.



Certificate Ceremony for Women Graduates at VTI Camp Korona

Moawin Foundation's Vocational Training Institute (VTI) Camp Korona, District Nowshera, hosted a certificate ceremony to celebrate the achievements of 75 women who successfully completed the Stitching & Dress Making program.

A remarkable highlight of the event was that 57 graduates are already earning between Rs. 10,000–15,000 per month by working from home. This milestone demonstrates the transformative power of vocational skills, enabling women to support their families, contribute to household income, and build sustainable livelihoods with dignity.



COMMUNITY RELIEF INITIATIVES

Food Package Distribution for Flood-Affected Families in Gilgit-Baltistan

In July 2025, Moawin Foundation's Gilgit-Baltistan team, in collaboration with GBDMA and the Civil Administration, carried out a relief initiative to support flood-affected communities in District Gilgit and Ghizer.

Essential food packages were distributed to families in need, providing immediate relief and reassurance during a difficult time. This effort reflects Moawin Foundation's commitment to standing by vulnerable communities in moments of crisis, offering not just assistance but also a message of hope and solidarity.

Nafli Qurbani Brings Relief to Families in Sheikhpura

Moawin Foundation, with the generous support of IHHNL, organized a Nafli Qurbani of 10 animals in Sheikhpura to support underprivileged families.

To ensure smooth operations, deserving families from the village were informed a day prior, allowing for an organized and dignified distribution. A total of 500 meat bags were distributed among households, reaching those most in need.
