



Founded in 2014, Moawin Foundation, is a not-for-profit organization (NPO) registered with SECP under section 42 of the Companies Act 2017. Moawin Foundation is an approved NPO under section 2 (36) of the Income Tax Ordinance 2001 and has signed an MOU with the Economic Affairs Division, Government of Pakistan to receive funding from international donors.

Moawin Foundation, through education and vocational training aims to counter the issues of inequality, lack of access to education, and economic instability to empower the underprivileged and vulnerable segments, particularly, the burgeoning youth population of Pakistan. It is hoped that through education and skills development, the uneducated marginalized segments of society will become self-reliant active citizens of Pakistan.

Public sector schools have the highest outreach in the country including the remotest areas of Pakistan. Moawin Foundation believes that with proper support, these public sector schools can contribute to bringing improvement in the quality of education.

Government has the resources to establish and maintain the infrastructure for educational institutions; however, there is a lack of capacity to ensure quality. MF believes that this gap can be filled with proper support mechanisms in these schools.

To uplift the quality of life of economically deprived sections of society through access to quality education and the creation of employment opportunities for the youth of Pakistan by imparting income-generating skills to them.







Skills Development

Vocational Training Institutes:

Moawin Foundation, in collaboration with the Government of Punjab, has established Vocational Training Institute (VTI) in Mahmunwali, Sheikhupura, and Qila Mian Singh, Nankana Sahib. Two VTIs in Karachi and Chakwal have been established recently with the financial support of the Tawing Fund and Mr. Saleem Akbani, a Pakistani philanthropist, based in the USA.

Hospitality and Tourism Training:

Trivelles Hotels (Pvt) Limited (THL) in collaboration with Moawin Foundation successfully completed the training on Hospitality and Tourism Management in which 25 candidates graduated in two batches. The series of trainings aim to provide skilled manpower to the industry, besides imparting income generating skills to the youth of Gilgit-Baltistan.

Stitching Center Mahmunwali

Moawin Foundation has partnered with Bismillah Textiles Limited in Faisalabad to start the cutting and packing of raw materials, which has also created employment opportunities for female VTI students. To support this initiative, MF constructed a lab with a store and washroom in the VTI located in Mahmunwali, Sheikhpura.

As a result of these efforts, about 70 female students and the local community can earn a living, as the center has received orders and workers are now earning a monthly salary ranging from Rs. 15,000 to 25,000. This initiative is a positive step towards empowering women and improving the economic conditions of the local community, demonstrating Moawin Foundation's commitment to creating opportunities for marginalized communities and promoting sustainable development.

Relief and Rehabilitation

MF is not only providing quality education to students but is also actively involved in humanitarian activities, such as Flood Relief and Rehabilitation, Cataract Eye Surgeries, WASH, and Wheel Chair Distribution



During the current flood emergencies, with the support of Mr. Rafiq Muhammad, a philanthropist based in the US, Central Asia Institute and Stichting Internationale Humanitaire Hulporganisatie Nederland (IHHNL), MF distributed food packages, warm essentials, mattresses, mosquito nets, water coolers, and other items to more than 200 families in districts Charsadda and Nowshera in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and gave Rs.50,000 grant to each family to re-start their lives after the devastating floods. Moawin Foundation also linked the flood affectees to Akhuwat Foundation to access interest-free loans.



Installation of Handpumps

As part of the "Provision of Access to Safe Water for Drinking and Other Domestic Use" project in collaboration with IHHNL, **1000 water hand pumps** have been installed across Pakistan. The project aims to provide access to clean drinking water for the communities with lack of access to clean water.



Stories from the Field

One teacher, one vision: A Beacon of Hope in the Mountains



Muhammad Tahir's story is a remarkable example of how determination, compassion, and hard work. Despite facing numerous challenges, he refused to give up and instead used his experiences to inspire others. After having to leave his nursing diploma course due to family responsibilities, Muhammad Tahir opened a store to support himself financially. However, he saw a need in his community and decided to take action. He used his own experiences to motivate young children in his community to study and

eventually started teaching in the mountain community of Maldukash with the support of Moawin Foundation. Maldukash is a small valley situated in the Diamer Valley at an elevation of 10,000 ft. Accessing the valley requires an hour-long drive on a rough road followed by a 40-minute uphill walk. During winters, the valley becomes snow-covered and difficult to reach. Initially, Qari Ahmed Ali, a local cleric, generously donated his house to be used as a school. Upon meeting the community, it was discovered that there was a pressing need for a school in the area. As a result of harsh winter weather conditions, the entire community relocates to Niat Valley, which is located between Chilas and Maldukash. "To ensure that the children can continue their education during this time, we needed a building that could accommodate them. A suitable under-construction house was found and, rented", says Tahir.



"Chilas is a conservative area where parents were initially hesitant to send their daughters to school. However, after seeing my efforts, they started sending more girls to the school. I am hopeful that this school will make a significant impact on the lives of children in the community," he added.

Despite being the head teacher of the school, Muhammad Tahir continued to pursue his own studies and has become a role model for others. Muhammad Tahir's success story is one of overcoming obstacles and using one's experiences to make a positive impact in the world. His determination and selflessness are an inspiration for others and a reminder of the power of education to change lives.



Together We Can: In Conversation with the Power Couple of Jagir Basin, Gilgit-Baltistan

Raja Naveed and Maria Bano, a couple from Gilgit-Baltistan, decided to fulfill their passion for teaching underprivileged children of the Gujjur community. Their journey started in 2019 with only a few students on the turf of Jagir Basin, Gilgit with the aim of giving them an educational environment that could provide them with a meaningful life.

Despite facing many challenges, including the lack of proper schools in the



area and the indifference of parents towards education, Raja and Maria persevered. They wanted to engage the parents in the process and succeeded in doing so, with the parents now supporting and engaging in their children's education.

“Our efforts paid off, and the school grew from a few students, who were being taught in an open space, to 145 students with a roof over their heads and proper restrooms for boys and girls. We would not have been able to achieve this without the support of Moawin Foundation.”
