General Pedagogy Training Conducted in Skardu

Moawin Foundation's Sub-regional office in Skardu, in collaboration with the Directorate of Education for the Baltistan region, organized a 5-day general teacher training program from April 30th to May 4th, 2024, for newly hired MF teachers. A total of 49 teachers from four districts of Baltistan participated in the training sessions. Among these participants, 15 were female teachers and 33 were male teachers. The training program included sessions on general pedagogy as well as ICT and Taleemabd training components. The primary aim of this training was to acquaint fresh graduates with innovative teaching methodologies, norms and values, lesson planning techniques, and effective classroom management strategies. The training concluded with a closing ceremony, during which Mr. Zulfiqar Ali, Director of Education for the Baltistan Region, graced the event as the chief guest. He commended the efforts of Moawin Foundation in Baltistan.

ECCE Refresher Course in Skardu

A 3-day ECCE refresher course was conducted in collaboration with the Early Learning Model Center in Skardu. Through interactive workshops, informative sessions, and practical exercises, participants gained insights and skills to enhance the quality of early childhood education in schools. Aahung's Training Session Empowers Teachers to Address Social Issues

A training session was conducted in collaboration with Aahung as part of the 'Changemaker' Initiative, with 37 teachers in attendance. The session focused on highlighting and addressing pressing issues in Pakistan, such as early marriages and out-of-school girls.

By empowering teachers with knowledge and resources, the initiative aims to create a ripple effect, ultimately contributing to positive societal change.

Pedagogy Teacher Training in Chakwal

Moawin Foundation in collaboration with Ali Institute conducted a 3-day pedagogy teacher training at GGHS Mulhall Mughlan in Chakwal. 29 teachers from GGHS Dehri Syedan and Mulhall Mughlan participated in the training. The training aimed to introduce teachers to core teaching skills (the 4 Cs), activity-based pedagogies, and E-learning, to ensure active learning among students.

Training Workshop on Strategic School Development Plan

A training workshop on the "Strategic School Development Plan" for Headteachers was conducted in Islamabad in which 30 Headteachers of Moawin-assisted schools of Islamabad, PD Khan, Dina, Mulhal Mughlan, and Dheri Syedan participated. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to FDE, CEO-DEA Jhelum, and Chakwal for their support in school improvement interventions in the region.

Kiran Ibtidai Culture Training Program

From April 22 to May 11, Kiran Foundation conducted a 20-day 'Kiran Ibtidai Culture Training Program' for ECCE teachers in which teachers from Moawin Foundation also participated. The training aimed to promote a positive culture for preschool students by integrating parental education into the educational system. Key topics included respecting the child, recognizing the critical importance of early years, role of mothers as caring adults in schools, and understanding trauma and its effects on children. Additionally, the sessions also focused on understanding the purpose of teaching, emphasizing the need for teachers' self-improvement before concentrating on students' development.

Leader In Me Orientation Workshop

A "Leader in Me" orientation workshop, in collaboration with Franklin Covey Pakistan, was held for headteachers and teachers at People's School Ghotki and Ubauro, with 24 participants. The session focused on guiding educators in adopting foundational structures of 'Leader in Me' in the school improvement process.




Life Skills Sessions in Baltistan

Moawin Foundation recently held life skills sessions as part of its LSBE initiative for students in the Baltistan region, specifically targeting MF-adopted schools. Dr. Shujat Mesam led the sessions, which took place in three schools: Community School Nar Shigar, Community Girls Middle School Qumra Skardu, and Government Girls Middle School Tinjus Skardu. The events saw the participation of 220 students who engaged in various group activities, exercises, and worksheets. The focus was on essential life skills, including interpersonal relationships, self-awareness, and effective communication. The initiative aims to provide students with the necessary tools to handle personal and social challenges, thereby enhancing their overall well-being and development.



MoU Signing with CEO-DEA Jhelum

Moawin Foundation signed an MoU with CEO-DEA Jhelum on 7th of May to extend its support to additional schools within the district. The agreement covers the renewal of four existing schools in PD Khan, along with the adoption of two new schools, GGHS Rohtas, and GBHS Rohtas in Dina. The MoU signing solidifies the commitment to enhancing educational opportunities in the region.



Meeting with GBTI Attock

On May 15, 2024, a meeting was held between Moawin Foundation and GBTI to strategize on uplifting 14 newly adopted government schools in Attock. The focus of the meeting was to discuss outcomes of the baseline survey conducted for improvement of schools to create a conducive learning environment for students. Both organizations expressed optimism about establishing a meaningful collaboration for collective impact.



Noon Academy Team Explores Collaboration Opportunities with Moawin Foundation

A team from Noon Academy, headed by Director Mr. Umair Babur Chishti, visited Moawin Foundation's head office in Islamabad. During the meeting, potential collaboration on summer camp for students, web designing courses, and a school setup for out of school children in Islamabad was discussed.





CEO, Moawin, Meets Mr. Shehryar Lodhi, TTWF, to Discuss Accelerated Learning Programs

Rear Admiral Foad Amin Baig, CEO of Moawin Foundation, met with Mr. Shehryar Lodhi of Teach the World Foundation (TTWF) in his office to discuss the adoption of schools for Accelerated Learning Program. They agreed to work together in Sindh and GB on ALP and Micro School Projects.

This collaboration aims to enhance educational opportunities for students through innovative digital learning solutions.
