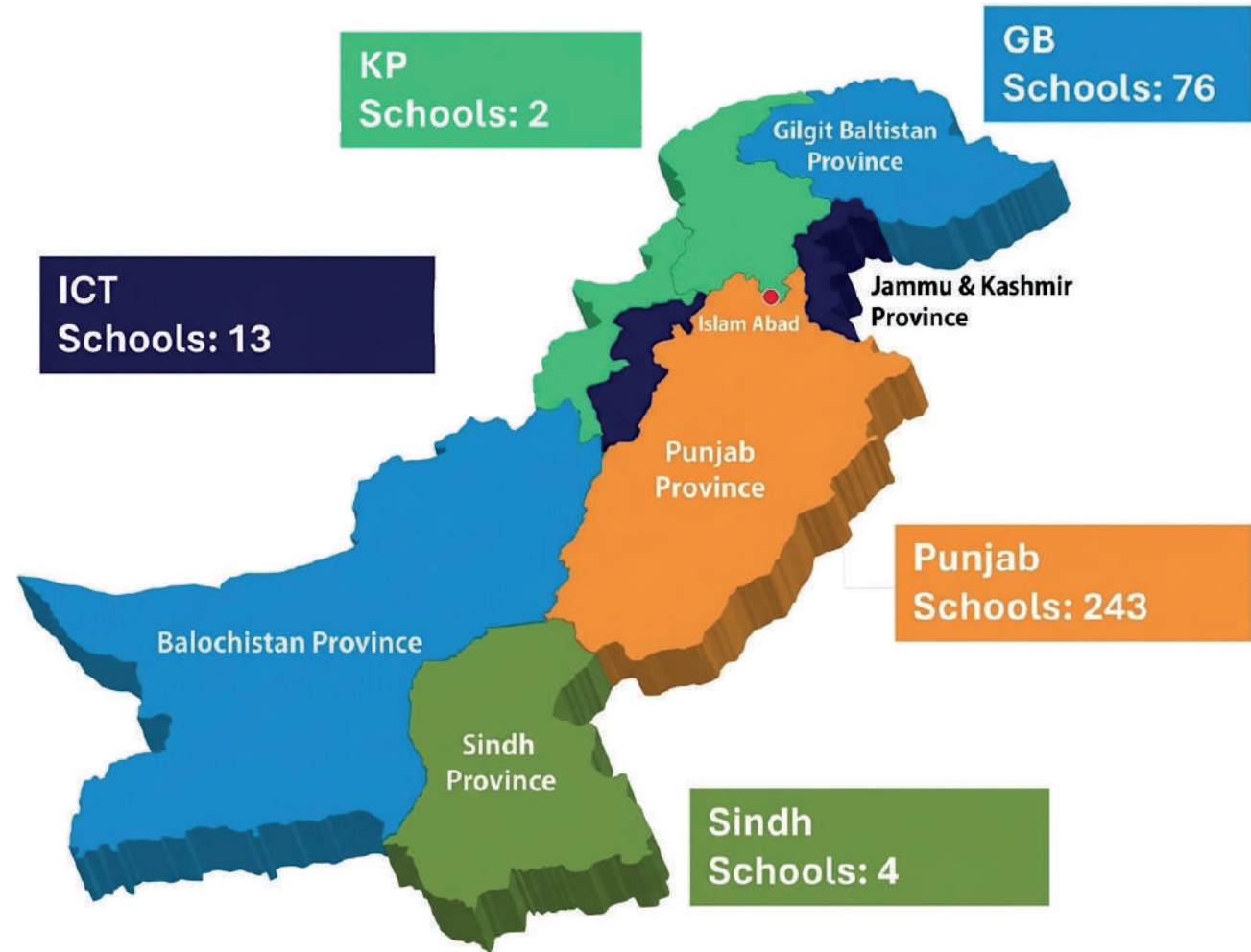
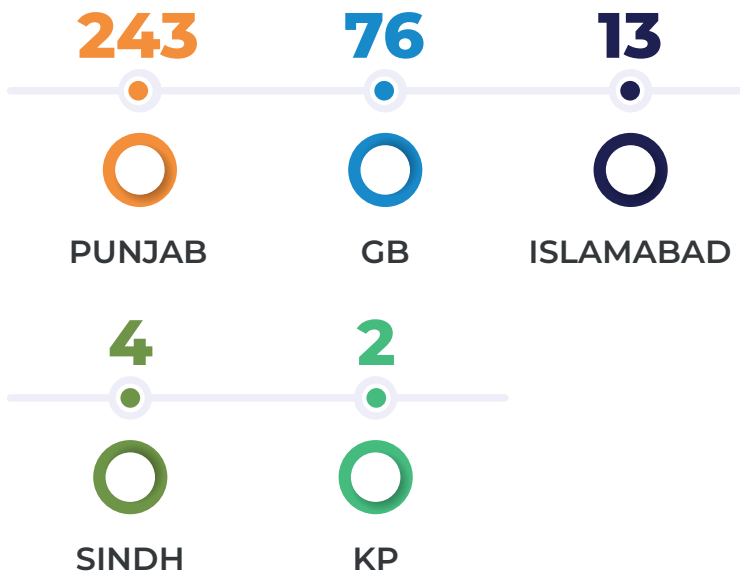

Our EdTech partnerships with Sabaq and Taleemabad have significantly strengthened cognitive learning outcomes across our schools, while formalized MoUs with NUST and Bahria University now provide our students with access to higher education resources and mentorship. Our flagship E-Learning initiative connected LUMS students with Moawin school students in Ghotki for online coaching, bridging the gap between urban and rural educational experiences.

Beyond academics, we continue to strengthen vocational training programs for women and youth, promoting financial independence and community resilience. As we embrace technology-driven solutions and scale our impact, we remain deeply grateful for the trust placed in us by our donors and partners. 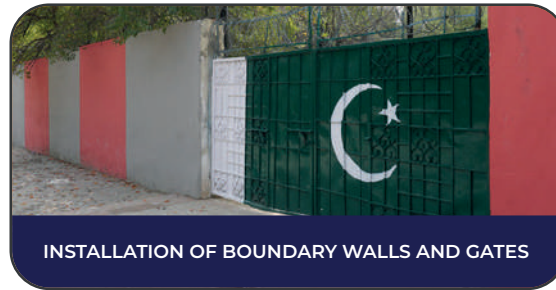

# TEACHERS CAPACITY BUILDING

The Moawin Foundation (MF) transforms education in marginalized areas through training in modern pedagogy, STEM, and life skills. Using a cascading "Training of Trainers" model, MF replaces rote learning with student-centered, inquiry-driven instruction. This approach creates a sustainable ecosystem of professional development and digital integration for teachers. Ultimately, MF empowers educators to provide underserved students with a high-quality, 21st-century education.



# KEY EDUCATION INITIATIVES IN 2025

## EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE & EDUCATION (ECCE)

Recognizing the critical importance of early learning, Moawin established 73 ECCE setups with specialized trained teachers, enrolling 2,500+ children in foundational learning programs.



## EDTECH INTEGRATION

The Moawin Foundation (MF) is bridging Pakistan's digital divide by integrating a 21st-century curriculum via a robust blended learning model. To bypass internet infrastructure gaps, the Sabaq & Taleemabad Offline Model hosts animated content on local "zero-data" servers. This initiative replaces rote memorization with critical thinking, ensuring remote students access high-quality, National Curriculum-aligned resources. By digitizing classrooms in underserved areas, MF ensures that geographical isolation no longer limits a student's potential. Our approach prepares students for a globalized economy through uninterrupted, high-tech educational equity.



# SUCCESS STORY

## ECCE OPPURTUNITIES

Zaheera, a dedicated and concerned mother, was determined to provide the best education and developmental opportunities for her son. However, her initial attempts at a private school didn't yield the expected results.

Zaheera discovered from her community members that Government Boys Middle School Dain, located in her neighborhood, had introduced an Early Childhood Development (ECD) center, equipped with basic facilities designed to nurture young minds. The center boasted specially designed furniture for children, a safe and comfortable environment, an LED TV for interactive learning, a small art and science corner, and an ECD-trained teacher. She shared stories of her child becoming more confident, responsible, and eager to learn.



# SUCCESS STORY

## EDUCATING WAZIRISTAN

Government Girls High School Darpa Khel, Miranshah, the oldest and once the only girls' school in North Waziristan, was severely impacted by years of conflict and insecurity.

Following the Government of Pakistan's Zarb-e-Azb operation and the restoration of peace in the region, the school was rebuilt. Moawin Foundation later adopted the institution at a time when enrollment had dropped to almost no students, limited to children from nearby households.

Through gradual recovery and renewed community trust, enrollment increased to 200 students and has now grown to over 800, marking a remarkable transformation in access to education for girls in the region.

## PAKISTAN'S FIRST ECO-FRIENDLY CLASSROOM

In partnership with Heritage Foundation, we launched Pakistan's first eco-friendly model classroom at Government Boys Primary School, Malpur, Taxila, demonstrating sustainable educational infrastructure.



## GENDER EQUITY IN EDUCATION

Moawin Foundation is deeply committed to closing the gender gap in education. Of our 45,668 enrolled students, approximately 60% (27,400+) are girls, reflecting targeted interventions to overcome cultural and economic barriers to girls' education.

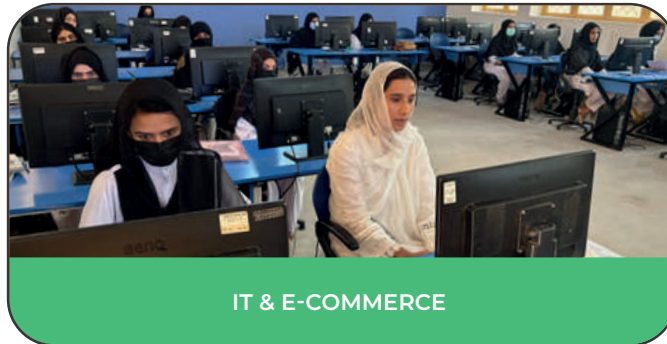
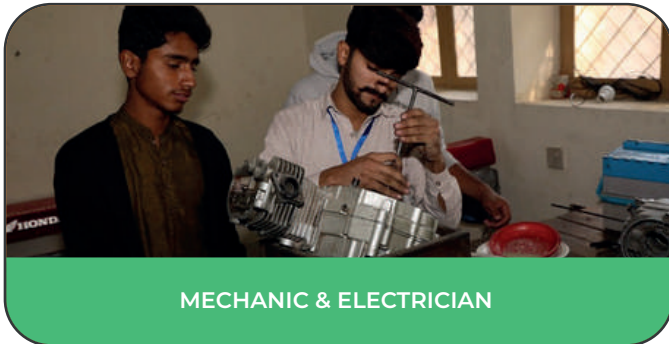

# SUCCESS STORY

Over 2,200 (76%) VTI graduates have established successful small businesses, secured employment, and achieved financial independence with Moawin Foundation's assistance. Among these stands out **Rabihat, a 35-year-old determined woman**, ready to provide for her teenage son after an unsuccessful marriage. With no education to fall back on and coming from a family with little means, Rabihat enrolled herself in VTI Nowshera's dressmaking course. Seeing her commitment, Moawin Foundation enlisted her in the **ROZGAR Scheme**, enabling her to establish her own business. She is now an established seamstress in her community, supporting herself and investing in her son's education.

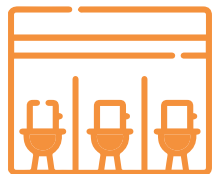

# SUCCESS STORY

Moawin Foundation's schools in Baltistan are the most remote, with limited resources. Moawin Foundation identified three such schools (**Bab-ul-Elam Public School, Nar Shigar Community School, and Umeed Public School**) with no washroom facilities. Students and teachers were resigned to using nearby fields, which raised concerns of disease and security, and were extremely unmanageable in Baltistan's extreme climate. These schools lacked these basic facilities for over 20 years, before the Moawin Foundation adopted the respective school and **constructed three washrooms each**. Teachers said this intervention would save crucial time and enable a better learning environment.

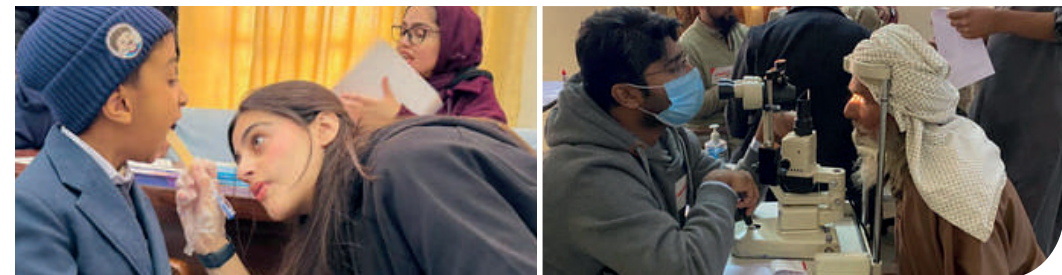
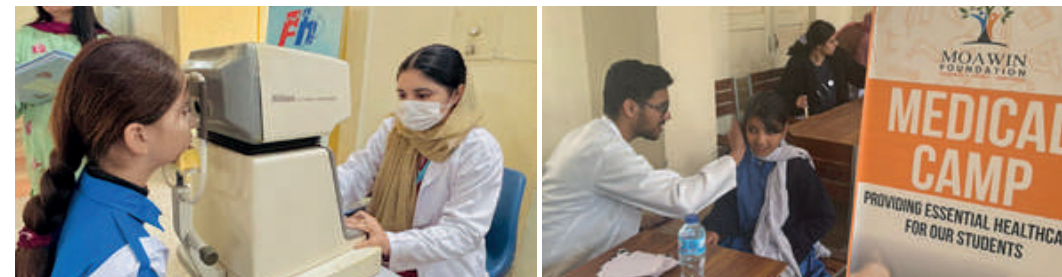

Moawin Foundation, founded in 2014 by Admiral (Retd) Muhammad Asif Sandila, former Chief of Naval Staff, is a non-profit organization dedicated to transforming marginalized and vulnerable rural communities in Pakistan through its Educate-Train-Empower concept. By adopting schools and providing skill development training to youth and women, we aim to deliver quality education and generate household-level impact. Moawin Foundation is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) under Section 42 of the Companies Act 2017, certified by the Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy (PCP), and tax-exempt by the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR), Government of Pakistan.

### Method of utilization of Zakat:

The organization's financial needs are being covered by Zakat that individuals and corporates from Pakistan and throughout the world contribute towards. Zakat received by Moawin Foundation is spent on the benefits of deserving persons. Moawin Foundation's management checks out the financial condition of applicants in respect of Zakat eligibility and gets zakat agency from the eligible for the organization. This agency results in tamliek (ownership) of Zakat for the benefit of Zakat eligible persons which enables Moawin Foundation to collect Zakat on their behalf and utilize it as per eligible needs of beneficiaries.

### Shariah Ruling:
