EMPOWERING WOMEN THROUGH SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOODS

In District Kharmang, 26 women picked up something new this month; fruit dehydration equipment, handed over at the Vocational Training Centre. But the real story is in what came with it - hands-on training in mulberry processing, dehydration and turning the harvest into things people actually want, like mulberry jam and the traditional delicacy Khanda. It's slow, careful work, and it's the kind that sticks. A woman who can turn her own fruit into income doesn't have to wait on anyone.



CAREER COUNSELLING FOR FUTURE ENTREPRENEURS

Freelancing Entrepreneurship: Words that sound abstract until someone actually breaks them down for you. That's what happened at FDE's Summer Fiesta 2026, where Moawin Foundation teamed up with Global Shapers Islamabad Hub to run a Career Counselling Session on Entrepreneurship - part of the wider "Career Counselling for All" push. Students walked away with a clearer, less intimidating picture of what's possible once school lets out.



MOAWIN FOUNDATION GROWING A GREENER FUTURE THROUGH KITCHEN GARDENING

Give a student a seed and a patch of dirt and something shifts. 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What started as homework time became a family learning journey.

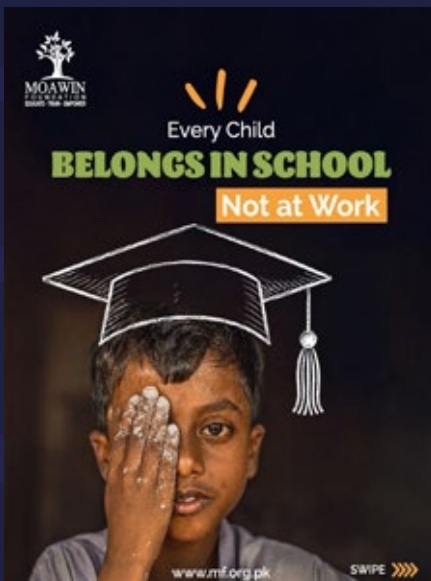
Saira now reads stories to her mother, explains classroom lessons, and practices new vocabulary with her. Their bond has grown stronger through learning.
